Freedom from Homosexuality and Gender Identity Disorder DR. MELVIN WONG



In this interview Dr. Wong highlights common misconceptions regarding homosexuality, provides definitions of various sexual conditions, and explores the difference between sexual

orientation and sexual behaviors. "Homosexual or transsexual behavior is a sin that a person chooses, but the sexual orientation generally is not something a person chooses," he explains. There is no credible evidence that people are "born this way", but there can be many factors in a person's early life (notably attachment issues in one's parental relationships) that can lead to sexual confusion.

Many Christians think homosexuals simply need to "repent" and are unaware of how to minister to these people with long-term compassion and understanding. They have both spiritual and emotional needs; many are involved in complex behaviors and habits that are difficult to change. One way the Church can help is to stop ostracizing homosexuals and look for ways to support them in their healing process through mentoring and accountability. Dr. Wong shares that he has witnessed many lives changed through the power of Jesus Christ.

"As we care for these individuals with the love of God, these can become situations in which the 'works of God' can be displayed," he says. "There are former homosexuals and transsexuals all over the world who are living proof of God's healing power, who are now ministering to countless others. The same thing can happen right here in Japan."

"Having been raised in an environment where my father was almost never around, I grew up never feeling loved. As a result, my heart was deeply scarred by the feeling that I couldn't love myself. I then found myself trying to fill that emptiness by turning to same-sex relationships."

One of the foundational concepts Sanae says she learned through Barbara's parenting class was the important truth that God creates each child as a unique individual, with differing abilities and gifts.

She admits that as a young mother, "... I was always comparing them to others, and as a result I wounded their spirits. I failed to find their strengths and praise them for what they could do. Yet through the parenting class and the principles I was learning from the Bible, my thought patterns began changing."

She also learned about the importance of Biblical discipline and the need to address sinful behavior. In Japan we usually only understand "sin" as doing things for which we could be arrested. But when we learn how God defines sin, we gain a much deeper understanding of how it is impossible for us to live up to God's standards in our own strength. If we love our children, we must discipline them; God is our example of a loving disciplinarian. (Hebrews 12:5b-8)

If God were to suddenly give you an extra hour every day, how would you use that extra time? Jesus told a parable about a rich man who gave his servants large sums of money to manage on his behalf. Two of the servants doubled the money placed in their care, while the third just buried it in the ground (Matt. 25:14-30). Time is one of the most valuable assets we have, and so it is important to consider how best to manage it.

You may not even be aware of what is actually eating up your time. Is it TV, videos, games, or surfing the internet? One way to find out is to take 2 days and keep a detailed record of how you spent your time. You may be surprised at what you learn .

"When I prayed, 'God, please give me hands and feet' and he didn't answer, I thought he didn't love me. I thought 'I'm just God's creative flop."

"When I was eight, I almost threw my life away because I felt so alone. If someone who had the same kind of body as me had told me 'Don't worry, everything will be alright,' I probably would have believed it. As it was, however, there was no one like that. I myself became that 'miracle' for other people instead."

"I'm thankful to God now for not giving me arms or legs. That's because I came to understand his plan. God is with both you and me and he has not forgotten about you or your family. If he has a plan for an armless and legless person like me, he certainly has one for you too."

Q & A with Dr. Hori

"If you're that concerned that magic and sorcery or other ungodly subjects in novels and movies will have a bad influence on your child, it's important for you to discuss and communicate to your children how this material should be viewed and point out its problems."

"Depending on the child, some will have difficulty distinguishing between fantasy and reality and so in these cases it's good to remind them that 'This is only a story."

"The Bible says, 'Whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is of good repute, if there is any excellence and anything worthy of praise, think of these things' (Philippians 4:8). This verse is helpful when you're having difficulty making the right decision."

Mr. Kumai, a manga artist, shares his obsession with manga during his youth, his Christian manga works, and the effects of media on children.

However, Mr. Kumai doesn't use the Bible as simply subject

matter for manga. His manga is just one step toward getting as many people as possible to pick up the real Bible. Even 'MANGA Messiah' was written for the purpose of getting people to read the Bible.

"There are manga with sexual and violent themes, so if a child becomes totally immersed in them it can be disastrous. I understand why parents worry. However, there's more to it than just simply taking it away from them. The most important thing is that a relationship of mutual trust is built.'

"Children watch their parents and instinctively sense whether or not they are walking with the Lord. So even though they may be caught up in manga or always playing games, if the standard of the parents is a firm one, they'll be able to absorb and resolve some of the problems. This is a rule of a family life that has God at its center."
