

Q: The shocking news of a foster parent killing a child through physical abuse hit the media recently.

I'm interested in foster parenting as well, but have some questions. How do I know that I won't end up doing something similarly tragic? What do you think caused this and

how can we understand it from a psychological perspective?

A: A mother expects her parenting to go perfectly but when it doesn't, she begins to despair. When her hard work isn't rewarded, anger wells up and she eventually explodes...

Another possibility is that when a parent has been abused and unloved as a child, she or he finds it harder to love their own children or foster children. As one mother once confessed to me, "Pastor, I'm ashamed to admit it, but I just can't seem to love my children...'

On the other hand, when abused or neglected children who feel unloved are put under foster care. they will often test their foster parents to see if they are willing to truly forgive them for any wrong and accept them fully into the family...

"...Children do not get angry for no reason. They are provoked by the environment in which they are living..."

One day, back when we had only three children, I came home from teaching at school with the expectation of relaxing after a hard day. To my utter surprise, as soon as I opened the front door, my wife thrust the baby into my arms and told me that she was going for

a walk and that it was now "my turn" to look after the kids! This sent an unmistakable message that she needed help and it served as one of my earliest lessons in parenting.
